



## **Documents Eligible for eFiling in Ontario**

Dye & Durham continues to monitor the courts in Ontario and across Canada as in-person filings gradually resume.

During this time, we will continue to be fully operational and commit to providing frequent updates on service levels, operating hours and documents permitted for filing across all Ontario Courts.

To avoid delays and maintain the highest safety standards, we will continue to eFile all eligible documents until all Ontario courts resume full operations.

For Service and Filing requests we recommend submitting all requests through our Legal i Link online solution where you will receive real-time updates on filings and services and scanned copies of affidavits of service.

- Jury Notice (Form 47A)
- Affidavit of Litigation Guardian of a Plaintiff under a Disability (Form 4D)
- Request for Bilingual Proceedings (Form 1)
- Consent to file documents in French
- Certificate of Action (Form 14)
- Consent or Court Order (Form 59A) required in support of filing a document online
- Proof of Service for documents filed online (Form 16B, 16C, 17A, 17B, 17C or any documents listed in Rule 16.09)
